YVEDDI is the Administrator for the L.H. Jones Family Resource Center. The Center serves as a "Focal Point" for Information and Referral Services. The following agencies are located at the Family Resource Center:





YVEDDI Head Start (336) 367-4993

Head Start prepares children for Kindergarten in 5 Star licensed center and works with the family to promote self-sufficiency. The program operates from August through May serving 385 children ages 3 to 5 years. Operational hours are 8:00 to 2:30 Monday through Friday. Unlike many pre-kindergarten programs, child medical and dental services, and individualized family support is included, as well as services to children with special needs, nutritious meals and snacks, professional staff, and transportation as feasible. All services are free to families who meet federal income guidelines.
