## What is CSBG?

CSBG is an acronym for Community Services Block Grant and was created by federal legislation to assist low income individuals and families in the early 1980's. CSBG funding supports projects that lessens poverty in communities and provides services and activities addressing employment, education, better use of available income, housing, nutrition, emergency services and/or health. It is also referred to as a Self-Sufficiency Program which is designed to assist individuals/families in overcoming poverty. We consider CSBG to be a gateway out of poverty. Each customer's situation is different, but the main criteria is that the potential customer must be below the federal poverty guidelines, must be willing and able to work, ready to take the steps to further their education or gain skills to procure a living wage job, set goals, and work closely with the Success Coach. It is a two year program designed to assist customers in overcoming barriers to becoming self-reliant. Our performance measures show that working together with our customers toward their goals produce results.





