Home improvements include: weather-stripping, air infiltration reduction, attic, floor, and wall insulation, water heater insulation, and other energy saving measures.

Heating Appliance Repair and Replacement Program (HARRP)
Assists low-income, elderly, and other families with heating system repair and replacement.

The Self-Sufficiency Program is designed to assist eligible and qualified individuals/families to overcome poverty and become economically self-sufficient.

Our service model assists customer's to obtain a higher education, gain employment in jobs paying a "living wage", meet challenges related to transportation and child care, and to empower themselves in the process of becoming self-reliant.

Domestic Violence Program

The Domestic Violence Programs are operated in the counties of Stokes, Surry, and Yadkin.

The major focus of services is to provide emergency services and assistance to persons who have been victimized by domestic violence.

Basic services provided by programs in each county are as follows: 24-hour emergency crisis line, court accompaniment, advocacy, off-site shelter, trained volunteers, community education, professional training, DV Program Advisory Council, and local Domestic Violence Program Office. Funded by the N.C. Council for Women, United Ways, United Funds, and Counties.

Regular Head Start (336) 367-4993

Head Start prepares children for Kindergarten in 5 Star licensed centers and works with the family to promote self-sufficiency. The program operates from August through May serving 385 children ages 3 to 5 years in Davie Stokes, Surry and Yadkin counties. Operational hours are 8:00 to 2:30 Monday through Friday. Unlike many pre-kindergarten programs, child medical and dental services, and individualized family support is included, as well as services to children with special needs, nutritious meals and snacks, professional staff, and transportation as feasible. All services are free to families who meet federal income guidelines. Funded by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Division of Public Health, and local support.



Migrant Head Start (336) 367-3450

Operates from June through October for ages 6 weeks to 5 years. Provides comprehensive family support and child development services for 65 children of Migrant Farm workers who have moved to Surry or Yadkin County within the last 24 months; and for seasonal families who no longer move but continue to work in agriculture as their main source of income. Funded by East Coast Migrant Head Start Project.

NC Pre-Kindergarten

Through meeting higher standards of quality, Head Start partners with the North Carolina Pre-Kindergarten Program (NCPK). The additional funding has enabled Head Start to lower child/staff ratios, extend services from 160 to 180 days per school year, and pay for higher qualified teachers, a proven indicator in helping children enter school ready to learn. 17 of our 22 Head Start classrooms are also NCPK sites with funding for approximately 146 four-year old, dually enrolled children.

L.H. Jones Family Resource Center

YVEDDI is the administrator for the L.H. Jones Resource Center. The Center serves as a "focal point" for Information and Referral Services. YVEDDI Services, Head Start, Transportation, Elderly Services, Senior Center, RSVP, CSBG, Workforce Investment Act Program, Mt. Airy Schools, Surry Community College, Literacy, GED, and ESL classes. LifeSpan Circle School- Jones Child Care, Yokefellow, J.J. Jones Alumni Group, Surry Association of Retarded Citizens, and other Community Services are located in the Center. This multi-purpose facility is available for community or private use for a nominal fee. Funded by the County of Surry, Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation, Contributors, Community Users, and Occupant Agencies/Organizations

Senior Centers of Excellence

Senior Centers are multi-purpose centers, which address the special needs of older adult. Programs offered promote socialization, recreation, health/wellness, education, and volunteerism. Periodic health screenings and information pertinent to seniors are also provided.

Through the Outreach and Disease Prevention/Health Promotion Programs, activities are also offered in communities throughout the County.

Centers (Yadkinville, Jonesville, East Bend, Mt Airy) are available for community or private use for a nominal fee.

Senior Centers are funded by the State of North Carolina, Counties of Surry and Yadkin, individual contributions, Foundations, United Fund, and United Ways. Throughout the year, the Yadkin and Foothills Arts Councils fund special projects.

Senior Enrichment Program

Transportation: Provides transportation for seniors 60+ years of age to and from community resources, i.e. medical care facilities, nutrition sites, grocery store and to other institutions necessary for daily living.

Congregate Nutrition: Provides a noon-time meal five days a week to seniors 60+ years of age, nutrition education, and other appropriate supportive services to enhance their ability to remain independent.

Meals On Wheels: Provides a home-delivered meal to persons 60+ years of age who are confined to their home without family available to prepare meals for them.

Legal Services : Provides attorney assistance to person 60+ years of age to deal with personal non-criminal issues.
