On June 2nd, 2022 the Community Transportation Program's (CTP) employee, Reginald "Redd" Nichols was certified as a Certified Safety and Security Officer (CSSO) by the Community Transportation Association of America. Redd started working for YVEDDI on November 21, 2013 as a part time van driver and was promoted in 2014 to the position of Road Supervisor. The following year in 2015 Redd was promoted to the position of Safety and Security Manager. Redd has been instrumental in the development and implementation of the CTP new hire training protocol and day to day oversight of the safety function of the CTP department.

The Certified Safety and Security Officer (CSSO) program is designed to help personnel build the transportation organization, enhance the professionalism of the internal team, safely serve its customers, fulfill its responsibilities in assisting in community preparedness, identify internal safety and security strengths and weaknesses and reduce system exposure to liability.

To become qualified as a CSSO an Individual will learn to:

- Take the CSSO Certification exam
- Identify system strengths
- Identify areas for improvement, and
- Develop safety, security and emergency preparedness programs
- Provide non-judgmental, confidential feedback,
- Give positive reinforcement where appropriate, and
- Be constructive, and not punitive, in nature.

The course starts with the basics of developing a safety culture in a transit organization. This culture is developed through the principles of what is called "Safety Management Systems (SMS)." SMS can be looked on as a businesslike approach to safety. It is a systematic, explicit and comprehensive process for managing safety risks. As with all management systems, a safety management system provides for goal setting, planning, and measuring performance. Once in place, a safety management system becomes part of the culture, the way people do

their jobs. The CSSO training leads the Individual through the nine critical areas of transit safety:

- Leadership and Management
- Transit Operations Vehicles and Maintenance
- Facilities and Maintenance
- Personnel
- Training
- Organizational Safety
- Organizational Security
- Community Emergency Response Preparedness
